Media Release: Community Joint Statement Calling for Fracking Ban or Moratorium

27/11/2012

"In light of the Parliamentary Commissioner for the

Environment (PCE)'s interim report on fracking released today, an alliance of 16 environmental groups, hapu and businesses have signed onto a joint statement, demanding a nationwide ban or moratorium on fracking.

"The PCE report identified many serious issues concerning fracking, from water contamination to air pollution and earthquakes. Putting it mildly, the commissioner described the current government oversight as 'complex and fragmented' which may allow important issues to 'fall between the cracks'. Indeed many things have fallen between the cracks, notably TRC's prior lack of resource consents for fracking, an issue pointed out by Climate Justice Taranaki (CJT) last year and acknowledged in the PCE report." Taranaki heroes Sarah Roberts, David Morrison and Michael Self have once again written excellent submissions calling out TAG Oil for illegal flaring and for drilling several illegal wells and other infrastructure in Southern Taranaki under a single well consent issued by TRC some years ago.

Todd Energy have also been pulled up in another submission by the trio after they were awarded the oddly rare "poor performance" rating by TRC with TRC's Fred McLay apparently caught lying about

an unpublished document. This is the lowest rating you can receive.

Why UN Climate Agreements Fail

History will undoubtedly deliver the harshest condemnations of the UN climate talks currently underway in Doha, Qatar. But the conference was laughable before it began; the inept "goals" of the talks stand in tragic-comic opposition to what we already know about climate change — that the climate has already changed in profound ways and its trajectory spells doom for civilization if drastic, coordinated steps are not taken in the immediate future.

For example, the Doha talks began with a shocking dose of reality: the World Meteorological Organization reported to the UN conference that an area of Arctic sea ice bigger than the United States melted in the past year, a rate faster than the most pessimistic scientists imagined only a couple of years ago.
