REPORT BACK from 'Save our Assets' hikoi and national fracktivist meeting in Wellington 4-7 May

A national gathering of scientists, farmers, councilors, parents and activists from groups around the country met in Wellington on 6th May to strategise for a frack free Aotearoa/NZ. The movement to stop fracking in Aotearoa is growing strongly as more and more frackfree zones are being declared and the push for a moratorium gathers momentum. A demonstration also took place, attended by about 100 people, visiting the Ministry of Economic Development, the mining lobby group Straterra and the Brazilian Embassy (Petrobras) sending a clear message that deep sea oil drilling and fracking are not acceptable.

This followed the 5000-people strong hikoi that reached parliament on 4th May in protest against the government's planned asset sales. The nation-wide groups working for a ban on fracking are planning some exciting events for later this year. We'll keep you posted.
