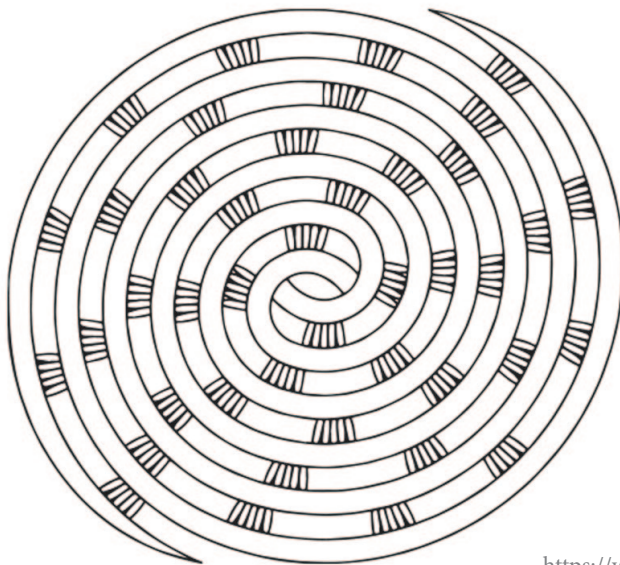

The Takarangi is a double spiral pattern prominent in Māori carving and holds deep symbolic meanings. The open spiral represents the entry of light and knowledge into the world, depicting the linkage of people with wairua / spirit. The spirals also signify past knowledge and experiences linking through time and space with the present.

GROW LOCAL MARKETS not global trade

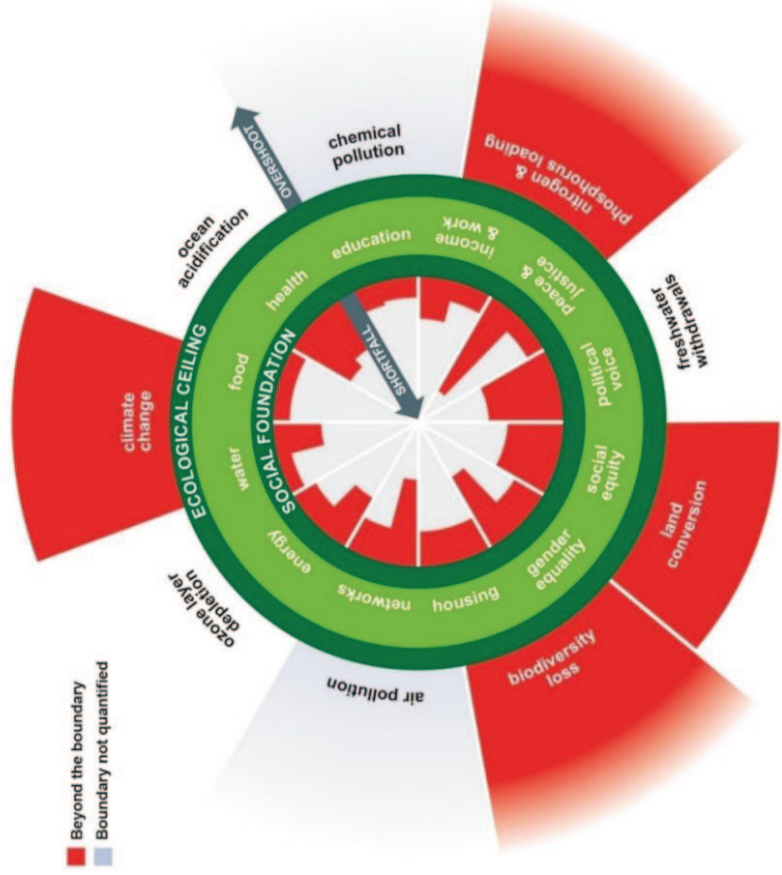
